### How to Read the CORE Transfer Guide

1. This document should only be used as a guide. Specific degree programs may require directed CORE classes. Advisement is necessary for proper selection of Northwest CORE requirements.
2. Direct equivalents are listed side-by-side.
3. Courses listed under '**other options**' do not have an equivalent course between institutions, but may still be used to satisfy the CORE requirement at Northwest.
4. Metropolitan Community College (Kansas City) courses marked with (\*) are listed under two different CORE categories. They may transfer to satisfy **only one** of Northwest's CORE areas, not both.
5. Some courses listed may also have direct equivalents to major-specific courses. These courses may be used as a CORE requirement **or** a major requirement if applicable, but not both.
